| 12. Leucanthemum, (Shasta daisy) single/double | 3 stems |
| 13. Muscari Ameniaceum (Grape Hyacinth) any other colours | 3 blooms |
| 14. Narcissus (Daffodil) trumpet, single any colour | 1 bloom |
| 15. Narcissus (Daffodil) trumpet, double | 1 bloom |
| 16. Narcissus (Daffodil) collection, different cultivars | 3 blooms |
| 17. Polygonatum, Solomon's seal | 1 stem |
| 18. Primula (primrose) any colour, including foliage | 3 stems |
| 19. P Paeonia, Peony-Double Red | 1bloom |
| 20. P Paeonia, Peony- Double or semi-double any other colour | 1bloom |
| 21. P Paeonia, Peony-Fern-Leaf, any colour | 1 bloom |
| 22. P Paeonia, Peony-Japanese, any colour | 1 bloom |
| 23. P Paeonia, Peony-Ito, any colour, named | 1 bloom |

24. P Paeonia, Peony-Tree peony named if possible	1 stem
25. Papaver Orientale (Oriental Poppy) any colour	1 bloom
26. Primula (primrose) any colour, including foliage	3 stems
27. Tulipa (tulip), single red	1 bloom
28. Tulipa (tulip), single any other colour	1 bloom
29. Tulipa (tulip), single, bi-colour	1 bloom
30. Tulipa (tulip), double	1 bloom
31. Tulipa (tulip), collection of cultivars stems must be uniform	5 blooms
32. Any other bulb, corm, rhizome tuber, named	1 stem
33. Any other blooming perennial	1 stem
34. Lilac, blue/purple	1 branch*
35. Lilac, white	1 branch*
36. Forsythia, in bloom	1 branch*
37. Any other flowering branch, small blooms- less than 2" diameter	1 branch*
38. Any other flowering branch, large blooms: 2 "or more in diameter	1 branch*

***Note: Branches must not be more than 30 inches from bottom to top**
